11 WHEREAS, human trafficking denies millions, mostly girls and young women, the right to live in  
12 dignity and to receive an education, and

13  
14 WHEREAS, slavery has not been eliminated...it thrives in the efforts of those who work in the  
15 trafficking business, and

16  
17 WHEREAS, human trafficking forces its victims into sexual and labour exploitation that is nothing less  
18 than slavery, and

19  
20 WHEREAS, the elimination of child sexual exploitation and child labour requires substantial  
21 strengthening of financial resources for international development, and

22  
23 WHEREAS, abolishing human trafficking is related to the issues of achieving Education For All and  
24 eliminating child poverty, and

25  
26 WHEREAS, unless we continue to put the issue in the spotlight and demand action from governments  
27 worldwide, the problem will continue and worsen

29 BE IT RESOLVED, that EI encourage all of its Member organizations, independently and through the  
30 EI Regions to actively lobby their governments and the international organizations to which they  
31 belong to commit themselves jointly and in concert with other countries to abolish human trafficking  
32 in all of its forms, and

34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that EI actively lobby organizations including but not limited to OECD, the  
35 Commonwealth, and UNESCO to initiate public debate on human trafficking in all developed countries  
36 in the interest of abolishing human trafficking in all countries.
