### **Background to the EI/PSI Sexual Diversity Forum**

EI and PSI launched the first international Sexual Diversity Forum prior to the EI Congress in 2004, Porto Alegre/Brazil.

The Forum tasked Education International and Public Services International to:

- Create awareness among EI and PSI member organisations, which have yet to develop policies and programmes to oppose discrimination on grounds of sexual orientation and gender identity;
- Reinforce learning and linking experiences between LGBT workers and trade unions at national, regional and international level, through facilitating communications and sharing of resources and information;
- Encourage the creation of national networks or groups to develop policies and capacity building programmes designed to promote respect for the rights of LGBT workers;
- Act as an advocacy mechanism to call for the explicit recognition of the rights of LGBT workers in international human rights instruments, including ILO Convention 111 (discrimination in employment);
- Seek to engage other global unions in this work and participate in advocacy coalitions with other organisations.

The Porto Alegre Declaration sets out a comprehensive agenda for trade unions, governments, NGOs and international organisations.







At the second EI/PSI Forum held in Vienna prior to the PSI Congress in 2007, EI and PSI reconfirmed their commitment to the Porto Alegre Declaration and launched a joint negotiating guide: "*Trade unionists together for LGBT rights!*" Copies of the publication, together with the outcomes of the second Forum, are available at <a href="http://www.world-psi.org/LGBT">http://www.world-psi.org/LGBT</a> and <a href="http://www.ei-ie.org/websections/content\_detail/3276">http://www.ei-ie.org/websections/content\_detail/3276</a>.
